#### **GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS:** For a complete listing of General Education courses and requirements, please visit catalog.uconn.edu.

#### Writing Competency

ENGL 1010 (Seminar in Academic Writing) or ENGL 1011 (Seminar in Writing through Literature) Plus an upper division "W" course in your major

#### Quantitative Competency

Three quantitative courses, one of which must be Mathematics or Statistics course

#### **Foreign Language Competency**

The equivalent of three years of a single foreign language at the high school and/or college level

#### **Content Areas 1: Arts & Humanities**

Take 5 courses with at least one from each category A-D. Courses must be from 4 different academic units. The 5th course may be selected from any category A-E.

A: Art

B: Literature (Select an ENGL course) C: History D: Philosophy & Ethical Analysis

E: World Culture

#### **Content Area 2: Social Science**

Take 2 courses

1. PSYC 1101 or PSYC 1103

2. Plus a second course from the list, not a PSYC

#### Content Area 3: Science & Technology

Take two courses from two different academic units, at least one of which must be a laboratory course. This requirement is fulfilled through the pre-Med courses noted below.

#### **Content Area 4: Diversity and Multiculturalism**

Take 2 courses, at least one of which must cover an international area of study, outside of the UCS.

URBAN AND COMMUNITY STUDIES DEGREE REQUIREMENTS: UCS majors complete a total of 36 course credits, 24 within the major plus an additional 12 related, toward the minimum 120 credits required to graduate from the University of Connecticut. GROUP I: Required Core Courses - Take both required courses = 6 credits GROUP II: Core - Select three courses from three different departments = 9 credits GROUP III: Methods - Select one course = 3 credits GROUP IV: Supporting - Select two courses = 6 credits

**Related Courses** - Select four courses = 12 (Courses outside of the major but closely related or courses within the major that are not URBN or cross-listed with URBN.)

A year of English classes. This would include any ENGL taken to meet the Writing Competency noted above.

# CHEMISTRY - Two to three courses

CHEM 1124Q + 1125Q + 1126Q (Foundations of General Chemistry I, II, III) or 1127Q + 1128Q (General Chemistry)

ORGANIC CHEMISTRY - Three courses CHEM 2443 + 2444 + 2445 (Organic Chemistry)

# PHYSICS - Two courses

PHYS 1201Q +1202Q (General Physics) or 1401Q + 1402Q (General Physics with Calculus) or PHYS 1501Q + 1502Q (Physics for Engineers I, II)

BIOLOGY - Two courses BIOL 1107 + 1108 (Principles of Biology)

MOLECULAR AND CELL BIOLOGY - These two courses are strongly suggested MCB 2000 (Introduction to Biochemistry) + MCB 2410 (Human Genetics)

**ELECTIVES**: After CLAS students have completed general education, major and related requirements most students still have not earned the 120 credits necessary to graduate. Any courses that a student takes to complete the 120 credit requirement are considered elective courses.
